Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Friends adopts the following accounting policies in the preparation of its financial statements.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are expressed in the presentational currency - the US\$ and are prepared in accordance with a modified cash basis of accounting. Under this basis of accounting, income is recognized when funds are received rather than when they are 'earned' and expenditure is recognized when payments are made rather than when they are incurred, except for the following treatment:

- Advances are initially recognized as a current asset in the Statement of Financial Position, until liquidation with supporting documents, at which point they are recognized as expenses in the Income Statement.
- Deposits to suppliers, loans to staff and other advances are recorded as Accounts Receivables in the Statement of Financial Position until these balances are settled.
- Salary tax payable withheld from staff salaries are recorded as Income Tax Payable in the Statement of Financial Position until payments have been made to relevant tax authorities
- The costs of fixed assets are charged to expenses upon acquisition. For control and management purposes, a fixed asset register is maintained.

Friends executes transactions primarily in local currency of each program office. Functional currencies are as follows:

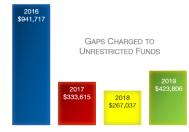
In 2019 each program office maintained its records in their primary currency. Transactions in currencies other than the primary currency are converted into the primary currency at the rate of exchange prevailing on the transaction dates. Exchange differences are recognized in the Income Statement.

Executive Summary



2019 marked the 25th anniversary of the first Friends program, the launch of exciting new ventures; the Friends Futures Factory, ChildSafe Experience, and Let's Eat! in Phnom Penh, as well as a 63% increase in beneficiaries reached (direct and indirect). However, as always, such achievements are not without some setbacks.

Funding gaps increased by 59%, predominantly in Vocational Training in Cambodia and Laos. Mith Samlanh, Friends Siem Reap and Friends Laos saw large surges in funding gaps, while Friends Thailand and Friends Indonesia enjoyed significantly



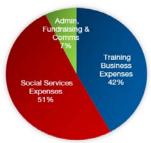
improved donor funding. Mith Samlanh was able to support its funding gaps with its own unrestricted income, while Siem Reap and Laos were supported by HQ's unrestricted income [see page 8].



Consolidated income increased by 5% to almost \$7.5m, taking it to the same level as 2015, before Friends' financial crisis (2016). The composition of this income was largely the same as 2018, with donor funding at 59%, training revenues at 35%, however, private donations and consultancy income proportions improved, at 3% and 2% respectively, of total income. Total private donations increased by 138% to \$248K total and consultancy income improved by 122% to \$166K total. Training Revenues remained steady with only a \$2K increase from 2018, yet, donor funding was enhanced by 4% to over \$4.4m. 25% of donor funding came from new donors, and UNICEF (Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Indonesia) remained the top funder of Friends.

Friends Indonesia gained the largest proportionate income increase of 76% [\$90K], while Friends Laos suffered a 15% donor funding reduction [\$113K], due to Caritas Australia withdrawing their activities in Laos. HQ increased income by 16% [\$451K] in all income categories, bar Training Revenue, while Mith Samlanh increased income by 4% [\$113K].

With the 5% income increase also came a 5% increase (\$301K) in consolidated expenses, to \$6.8m. The largest increases in both absolute value and proportion of total, were our Direct Project Costs (by 16% and \$95K) and Other Social Business Costs (by 12% and \$104K). Our costs for employment placements, vocational trainings, school reintegration, harm reduction and family support, all increased, evident in our beneficiary numbers. Our cost of

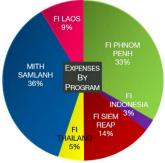


sales also increased, by \$70K (9%), which caused a reduction in our net profits [see page 12]. Our ChildSafe Alliance partner grants, which are wholly dependent on securing donor grants, decreased by 7% (\$29K),. This decline was all in Cambodia,



where our partners are supported by sub-grants from UNICEF, EU/Save the Children, GFATM/NCHADs. Regardless, we did acquire new funds for a partner in Laos (Appren) from Save the Children, and our existing Philippines partner (Bahay Tuluyan) from World Childhood Foundation via Friends Thailand. Friends overall expenses comprised of 51% for Social Services [2018: 50%], 42% for Social Businesses [2018: 42%], and 7% across Administration, Grants & Fundraising, and Communications [2018: 8%].

The highest proportion of expenses are typically borne by Mith Samlanh, whose costs increased by 6% to \$2.9m. Both HQ and Friends Siem Reap saw no change in total expenses, however, all three programs in Cambodia were subject to a mandatory "Seniority Pay", under Cambodian Labour Law revisions, costing a total of \$106K. Friends Indonesia increased total costs by 87% to \$200K thanks to increased donor funds to support the Futures program in Jakarta, as well as Child Protection System strengthening in Palu, Indonesia. Friends Thailand also increased their costs by a large 18% to \$420K. The most notable increase in Thailand is in Employment Placement costs from \$3.9K in 2018 to \$28K in 2019. Friends Laos also saw costs increase threefold in Employment Placement and in rent predominantly due to the three-year payment of Khaiphaen Restaurant rent.

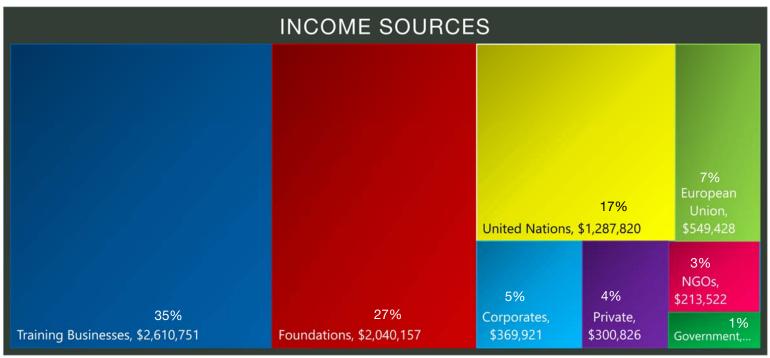


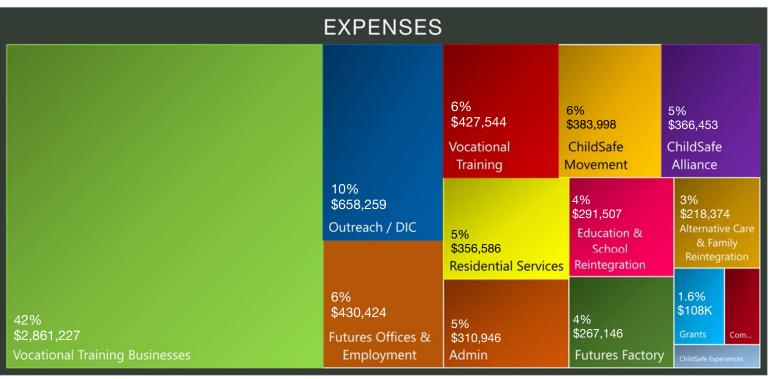
The Vocational Training Businesses maintained their sales revenue levels at \$2.6m, same as 2018. Net profit, however, dropped from \$373K to \$310K, bringing our sustainability to 7% [Net profit as a % of our total social service costs]. The TREE Restaurants group increased their sales revenues by 4%, while the FNS group suffered a 15% decrease in sales. The consolidated net profit is entirely derived from the TREE restaurants, while FNS made losses of \$10K.

At the time of writing, the entire world has been devastatingly impacted by the global pandemic that is COVID-19. The landscape at Friends has not escaped the scathing ongoing consequences of the virus resulting in service closures, loss of proposed donor funding, loss of expected sales revenue, and the critical impact on our beneficiaries. Friends has reacted rapidly in our emergency response, adapting services to a new context and strategizing how we will recover and rebuild. On pages 52 and 53, our annual budgets pre and post COVID-19 highlight the drastic cuts we have had to endure to safeguard our survival. However, we are confident that Friends' resilience will prevail despite the \$3m budget cuts made over a nine-month period.

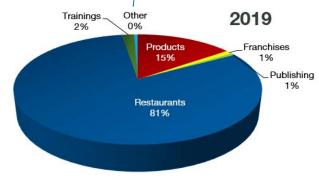

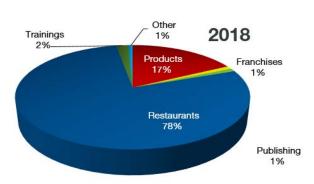

The Training Restaurants

Historically, Friends the Restaurant in Phnom Penh has always been the highest earner, in both sales and net profit. However, 2019 saw Romdeng Restaurant break the record, achieving 7% more sales than Friends the Restaurant and 25% more net profit. Romdeng's sales increased by 13% from 2018, while Friends the Restaurant increased only by 1% and with a 25% decrease in net profit.

A third training eatery, Let's Eat!, was launched in Phnom Penh at the Friends Futures Factory in May 2019, with the support of The Intrepid Foundation, which incredibly generated \$16,700 in sales - an exceptional first 7 months when compared with its sister Let's Eat! in Siem Reap, which generated \$6,700 in sales (a 33% drop from 2018).

Marum Restaurant in Siem Reap saw a 6% sales reduction from 2018 and a drastic 90% drop in net profit. Donor support for Marum was also reduced, from \$35,000 in 2018 to \$13,000 in 2019.

Vientiane's Let's Eat! training restaurant saw a name change to Mini-Makphet (little brother of the original Makphet Restaurant which closed in March 2017), with a new menu also based on the original. Supported by Luxembourg Development Cooperation and WISE Sarl, Mini Makphet generated \$13K in sales and retained \$2,400 in net profit. Meanwhile, in Luang Prabang, Khaiphaen Restaurant maintained sales levels and reduced its losses by 94% from 2018, (2019 loss: \$700), thanks to much-needed financial support from several donors.

The TREE franchise increased net profit by 94% to \$88K, even though franchise fees received only increased by 2%. This is predominantly through restructuring teams and reducing expenses. From the total income, \$27,960 was earned through independent partners: Sandan Restaurant Sihanoukville, Cambodia and LinkAge in Yangon, Myanmar

Friends 'N' Stuff

Though the number of FNS outlets remained unchanged, total sales suffered a 15% drop, and the \$58K net profit seen in 2018 became a loss of \$10,500 in 2019. Except for the Laos stores, all Friends 'N' Stuff outlets performed worse than in 2018. FNS in Vientiane flourished with the revival of Mini-Makphet, and FNS in Luang Prabang reduced its cost of sales by selling only existing stock.

The flagship FNS on Street 13, Phnom Penh remained in a temporary location until May, when it reopened in the Friends Futures Factory with a complete facelift. Possibly due to the temporary location, sales dropped 18% and the

store made a loss of \$8,400 [2018 net profit: \$47,600].

FNS in Siem Reap also suffered with a 28% drop in revenue, and a large loss of \$22,000. Expenses remained steady from 2018, however the profit margins on wholesale products needed an upward revision.

Collectively, FNS income comprises 16% of total sales generated, while TREE restaurants contribute 81%. However, unfortunately Friends 'N' Stuff was unable to contribute to net profit in 2019, despite the incredible impact made for caregivers.

Vocational Trainings

All decentralised Vocational Trainings received much needed contributions from donors. The Phnom Penh VTs generated 69% of the total VT income and 38% of the net profit, while Siem Reap generated 26% of income and 32% of not profit.
